Gris is the dedicated mother of twin sons, Edgar and David, who are 1 year and 4 months old. She and her husband decided to begin a new life in the U.S. when they found out they were pregnant. They wanted a better future for their sons.

In Mexico, Gris had been a teacher for children ages 3 to 6 years old and was passionate about helping her students reach their full potential. The move, along with being a new mother and the transition into American culture was difficult, and she did not know the English language. For the first few months, she was very lonely and was afraid to leave the house.

"In Mexico, I was a very independent person," describing herself. Being a new mother, it was hard to seek new opportunities and although she had worked with

children most of her career, caring for newborn twins was quite the challenge. After David and Edgar were born, she began looking for day care centers and schools in hopes of returning to work. Her sister-in-law told her about AVANCE's free parent education program for parents and young children. She had attended the program herself the year before and it helped her.

Since joining the Parent Child Education Program, Gris has learned to nurture each of the twins' unique personalities. "David is the more outgoing one, who loves to read and Edgar is more timid and likes hands-on activities, like playing with the toy blocks." She has also learned to speak English.

She loves seeing the smiles on her sons' faces when the Early Childhood teacher, Teresa, greets them each morning. Her hope as a parent is to encourage her children's independence, but also act as a confidante when they need help. Her husband is also another source of motivation for her. "He is always asking me if I have any homework," she laughs.

As for her goals after AVANCE, she hopes to volunteer and help other mothers just like her in the community. She plans to keep learning English to continue her career as a teacher. When asked what keeps her going she says, "I see the love that I have for being a teacher of my own sons." Congratulations, Gris!

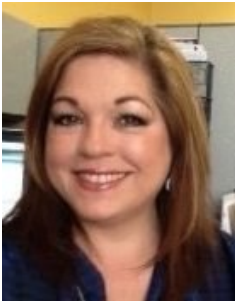


'Tis the Season of Holiday Giving

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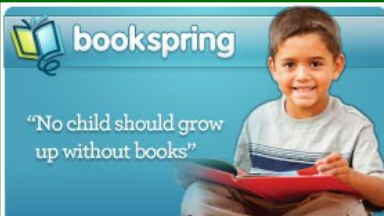
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"No child should grow up without books"

Creating a Love for Reading



Thanks to a partnership with BookSpring and Reading is Fundamental or RIF, AVANCE parents and children had the opportunity to create books of their own to enjoy and receive new books as well.



Using magazines, families cut out photos and glued them onto construction paper. The pages were then bound together with yarn to create a homemade book. Parents use their books to practice reading to their children. Upon finishing the activity, each family was awarded a brand new book to take home. The activity promotes parent-child time, creativity, pre-literacy, and reading to children. BookSpring provided almost 200 books for the children and parents or caregivers enrolled in our six AVANCE sites throughout the community.
